Software Developer Apprenticeship

Summary

Software Developers are the creative minds behind computer programs. Some develop the applications that allow people to do specific tasks on a computer or another device. Others develop the underlying systems that run the devices or that control networks. In their daily work a Software Developer interacts with internal and external parties including users/customers and team members from a range of specialist fields including designers, developers, engineers, analysis and project/ delivery managers.

An employee in this occupation will be responsible for developing software solutions across full software development life cycle from research and development through continuous improvement to product/service retirement. They may work both autonomously and as part of wider teams, typically reporting to a more senior member of their team.

Entry Criteria

- A minimum of 4 GCSE's Grades 9-4 (A-C) including Maths and English
- A relevant level 3 qualification/ apprenticeship or equivalent.

Duration

24 months + End Point Assessment

- Software development life cycle
- Similarities and differences between software development methodologies
- Algorithms, logic and data structures relevant to software development
- Create logical and maintainable code
- Software testing frameworks and methodologies
- Develop effective user interfaces
- Build, manage and deploy code into the relevant environment
